

DRIVING FROM VENICE AIRPORT?

Here are Max's suggestions if you are hiring a car and driving to San Cassiano

There are two options

1. **The direct route** which goes through mountain roads- easy and straight route up to Cortina d'Ampezzo. After Cortina d'Ampezzo you'll find mountain style windy roads. This road is only possible with good weather conditions which means no snow storms in the last few days and on the day you'll be driving. Ask the car hire company about weather conditions or search on google before you leave. Here's the route below:

2. **The highway route**- if the weather is not favourable and you'd like an easy drive it's better to take the highway up to **Brunico** and then follow the signs to **Val Badia** and **San Cassiano**. The highway will take you through some main cities such as Padova and Vicenza. Here's the route below:
